I wish to thank all of you for keeping my dream alive. When the Association was re-established back in 2000, who would think we would be starting our 24th year? A great many of the officers are still volunteering their time to keep our assocation alive of which I am truthfully grateful. We have faced trying times with COVID and the world being what it is today.

We are hoping that some members might be able to help with a problem. As you all know, we took the task of redoing the mural the artist Wyland painted on the outside of the gym wall on October 1, 1998. The mural faces the sun and has gone through all types of weather. Many different opinions were suggested but none of them have panned out. In August 2022 Marlene, Pam, and I met with a Maine Artist & Muralist Ryan Adams and his wife. He is looking for a picture, if possible, of the original painting. We are hoping some of you may have one. If so, please contact either Pam or myself. Contact was made through the Wyland Foundation and one of the gentleman on the Advisory Committee has said he would try to find the pictures in the archives but mentioned it would be like "looking for needle in a haystack". That request was made in spring of 2022. Any help would be greatly appreciated.

A friendly reminder, when we applied for federal and state for a non- profit association, we were considered by the federal government as a non - profit, the State of Maine non-profit Association, but NOT by Maine government standards. So any member who donates \$25 or more, I have to make out a federal form and send a formal letter of thanks to the donor. The formal letter includes the information of us being a 501(c) (3) and they can claim it on their taxes if they wish. We appreciate any amount of money because every dollar counts. To update you as to how the Associatuion has faired financially over 2022, according to my records as Co-Treasurer, I am giving the following information: Being able to return to have dances as fundraisers, both the Spring and Harvest dances had over 100 in attendance and over 50 members donated \$25 or more. Between the donations to The Alumni Scholarship, Joel Barnes Scholarship, and the postage funds account, we are able to transfer \$8,000 to The Town of Old Orchard Beach Schools Scholarship Trust. Use of the room at Duffy's now requires a fee, but they give us a discount. Our account is in the TRUST where we only use the interest accrued for scholarships.

I hope this finds you all well and healthy for 2023 and a better year for all. Again, thank you for all your continued support to keep the Association alive.

Carolyn Williamson Lamontagne '76




The OOB Alumni thanks Carolyn and SBSO for choosing US for the \$1000 contribution to a charity in her name. Lamontagne became a teller with
